NOTICE OF TAXPAYER'S RIGHT TO ELECTION TO REDUCE TAX RATE

If the district adopts a combined debt service, operation and maintenance and contract tax rate that would result in the taxes on the average residence homestead increasing by more than eight percent, the qualified voters of the district by petition may require that an election be held to determine whether to reduce the operation and maintenance tax rate to the voter-approved tax rate under Section 49.23603, Water Code.

The Viridian Municipal Management District proposes to use the tax increase for the purpose of essential water, sewer, drainage services, roads, and related operational, maintenance and administrative services.
